
Landscaping for Wildlife at Ivy Creek Natural Area

A Partial List of Wildlife Friendly Plantings at the Ivy Creek Foundation Ed Center



Tall deciduous trees along the south side of the building provide shade in summer yet let the sun shine through in winter. Eastern redcedars placed along Earlysville Rd.. shield the area from wind and noise as well as provide a year-round site for birds to nest and hide and protection from rain and snow. Shrubs such as Itea, Fothergilla, and Winterberry grow as a tangle of branches providing birds and small mammals a place to hide and rest. Ensuring a long flowering season will attract insects through the summer and fall to serve as pollinators and provide an important food source for birds as will seeds and berries through the seasons.
